ITINERARY

DAY 1, Sunday - Newark to Berlin

Depart Newark on a non-stop United Airlines flight arriving in Berlin the following morning. Meals, beverages and entertainment aboard. (Flight times are subject to change until ticketed.)

DAY 2, Monday - Berlin

Arrive today in Berlin where your tour manager will greet you at the airport. This morning, enjoy a guided tour of Berlin. View the major sights of the city including the Reichstag building, Brandenburg Gate and Checkpoint Charlie, the remaining symbol of the former Berlin Wall. Hop out to walk along the remains of the Berlin Wall. View the Unter den Linden Street and Kurfurstendam, as well as the State Opera House and the Cathedral. See the many famous museums on Museum Island, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Afterwards, you will check into your hotel with the rest of your afternoon free. This evening, gather with your fellow travelers for a Welcome Dinner with wine.

DAY 3, Tuesday - Berlin / Potsdam

After breakfast, we travel to Potsdam, known as the "City of Palaces," well known as the meeting place of Roosevelt, Churchill and Stalin in 1945 at the Cecilienhof Palace for the Potsdam Conference, and where they created post-World War II Europe. Another stop is made at the Sanssouci Palace, former summer residence of the Prussian kings and German emperors. During a walking tour of the castle grounds, pass the old windmill, explore the lovely gardens and see the burial site of Frederick the Great before returning to Berlin. Enjoy the remainder of your day at leisure.

DAY 4, Wednesday - Berlin / Sachsenhausen

After breakfast we'll learn about a crucial period in history and visit Sachsenhausen, a concentration camp that played a pivotal role in the Holocaust. Built in the summer of 1936, Sachsenhausen initially facilitated the removal of "antisocial" elements of society, as Berlin hosted the spectacular Olympic Games. During the Third Reich more than 200,000 people were imprisoned. Hear stories of valor from the British Royal Marine Commandos that refused to have their will broken. Later, visit the cells, execution grounds, crematorium, Pathology Laboratory, hospital, watchtower, SS training camp and more. This special tour around a storied location of WWII history is harrowing, but it lends visitors an unparalleled insight into the reality of the Holocaust. After our visit we return to Berlin with your afternoon and evening free.

DAY 5, Thursday - Berlin / Dresden / Prague

In the morning we continue our journey via Dresden, a beautiful Baroque city. There will be a sightseeing tour upon arrival, featuring the Zwinger Palace, Semper Opera House and other important historic sites. You'll have some time on your own before we continue our journey to one of the most attractive cities in central Europe, Prague.

Tonight you will enjoy a special three-hour cruise departing from

Cechuv Bridge, giving you the opportunity to see the major landmarks in Prague at night and accompanied by live music. In addition to Charles Bridge, Prague Castle, the Rudolfinum, National Theatre, Dancing House and Vysehrad, you can admire the many lesser known sights such as the Metronome at Letna, the Emmaus Monastery, Agnes Monastery, Podoli waterworks and the historical power plant Stvanice. The boat also passes through the oldest lock chamber on the river Vltava. Upon arrival you will be greeted by a friendly crew who will offer you the traditional Czech welcome aperitif and there is an open buffet for the duration of the cruise. Experiencing these views from a boat at sunset is a memory that will be hard to forget.

DAY 6, Friday - Prague Lesser Town and Old Town

This morning's sightseeing will include a walking tour of the Lesser Town and the Old Town, viewing the Infant Jesus of Prague Church and include the 14th century Charles Bridge, with its 30 baroque statues of various saints. From here, admire the view of Prague Castle. Continue through the Old Town Square to view the famous Old Town Hall Tower & Astronomical Clock, viewing the Municipal House, Powder Tower and the Jewish Quarter. We continue on our comprehensive tour including three splendid interiors and at the same time providing insight on local politics, religion and products. This afternoon, we cross the Vltava River to see the Royal Castle of Hradcany and visit the Cathedral of St. Vitus, the Old Royal Palace, St. George's Basilica, and the Golden Lane with the Daliborka Tower. Enjoy the many sights of Prague with dinner on your own this evening.

DAY 7, Saturday - Prague / Vienna / Schonbrunn

After breakfast we depart for Vienna. We travel through the Austrian countryside before arriving in Vienna, once the center of the mighty Habsburg Empire. Upon arrival, you will visit Schönbrunn Palace for a guided tour. Immerse yourself in the world of Empress Maria Theresa and Emperor Franz Joseph I. The magnificent architecture and exquisite interiors make Schönbrunn Palace perhaps the most important site in Austria.

This evening you will take a short drive to Vienna's Prater Park, one of the oldest in the world. Then you continue to the picturesque village of Grinzing. At a local restaurant, you'll indulge in a festive night of music, food and entertainment. Dinner will feature dishes typical of traditional Austrian Heurigen, or wine taverns. During your meal, you'll have the chance to try some of the tavern's own locally made wine—the perfect addition to your cozy Old-World setting.

DAY 8, Sunday - Vienna City Tour

This morning you may sleep in a bit or begin to enjoy the lively city of Vienna on your own. This afternoon you will walk to the Vienna State Opera House. We tour the grand interior which includes a crystal chandelier weighing over 3 tons. This temple of music was built in 1869 and today still ranges amongst the most highly rated opera houses in the world. Our guide takes us on a journey through over 1000 years of power, wealth and glory. Experience imperial Vienna at the Habsburg Treasury. View precious items collected by the Holy Roman and Austro-Hungarian Emperors.

Amongst many other treasures we see the Imperial Crown Jewels, the Crown of Charlemagne, the Holy Lance, and other precious stones and jewels, as well as priceless robes of numerous kings and queens. The balance of the day is free to enjoy Vienna on your own.

DAY 9, Monday - Vienna Sightseeing

Today we visit the Hofburg Palace, historic former seat of the emperors and their governments, where you admire the glittering collection of Imperial regalia in the Treasury. Currently the residence of the president of Austria, the Hofburg Palace has expanded over the years, adding wings designed by top architects and named for some of the great nations of the world. Later, continue to the soaring Gothic St. Stephen's Cathedral, the most famous landmark in the city. Enjoy this beautiful city with lunch on your own. The balance of the day is free to continue your love affair with Vienna. Perhaps you might enjoy visiting the famed Spanish Riding School or enjoy Vienna's famous Sacher Torte, the most famous chocolate cake.

DAY 10, Tuesday - Vienna to Budapest via The Danube Bend

After breakfast we travel to Budapest via the Danube Bend. The north of Budapest is one of the most beautiful regions of the river, which flows through eight countries. The first stop of the excursion is Esztergom, the birthplace of the First Hungarian King Stephen I. The town was and remained the centre of the Catholic Church in Hungary. One of the most beautiful renaissance monuments of our country can be found in this town: the Bakócz Chapel and the Treasury preserving masterpieces of the ecclesiastical art. After visiting Esztergom the tour leads us to Visegrád where the ruins of a Royal Residence can be found. Then the picturesque and historic town of Szentendre is the next stop on the bank of the Danube. A population of ethnic Serbs settled here in the 17th century. Szentendre has always been a popular place for artists. One part of this special atmosphere is given to the town by the big colony of artists whose gallery and exhibitions are open to the public. If we have time, we also stop at the biggest Europe diamond factory, Caprice Hungarian Jewellery Center, for a tour and shopping. (The order of towns visited may differ.)

Then you continue to lovely and exotic, Budapest. You will enjoy a panoramic sightseeing tour of one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. It will include the many architectural highlights of the Buda hills and downtown Pest. See the Opera House and Heroes' Square and then cross the Danube to visit Gellért Hill and historic Matthias Church. From atop the Fisherman's Bastion, you'll have great views of the city and the neo-Gothic Hungarian Parliament. Finally you will arrive at your hotel for check-in. This evening enjoy dinner at a local folklore Hungarian restaurant with wine.

DAY 11, Wednesday - Budapest City Tour

After breakfast, we tour three splendid interiors which provides insight on local politics, religion and products. The Hungarian House of Parliament is a stunning interior and the Hungarian Crown Jewels await us there. Only a limited number of visitors are allowed to visit each day. Next we tour St. Stephen's Basilica,



the largest and most impressive church of Budapest where a relic, the mummified hand of St. Stephen, can be seen. Finally our guide takes us to the historic Great Market Hall where, like a hundred years ago, the locals still do their everyday shopping. At your leisure, absorb the unique atmosphere with over 100 market stalls and an endless choice of regional products and enjoy lunch on your own. After, we tour Budapest's rich Jewish heritage beginning with a visit to the Great Dohany Synagogue which ranks among one of the top sights of Budapest. This Moorish style building is Europe's largest and the world's second largest Synagogue. Travel to a different section of town to explore the chilling Hungarian Holocaust Museum. Additionally, view the Jewish Museum, the Tree of Life and the Raoul Wallenberg Memorial. Tonight enjoy a relaxing cruise down the Danube on a private boat, accompanied by a local commentary expert. The views from the river are magnificent as you admire the skyline from a different perspective of the city after sunset. Our Farewell Dinner features Hungarian specialties and wine.

DAY 12, Thursday – Budapest Free Day

Today is a free day in Budapest to enjoy on your own. There is wonderful shopping. Perhaps you might also enjoy one of the famous spas/thermal Baths in Budapest. It is always delightful to wander around the pedestrian zone.

Cancellation:

Once a partial or full payment has been made, cancellations will only be accepted in writing. Cancellation terms will be applied based on the date that the written cancellation is received and based on the following dates prior to departure.

100 to 61 days prior to departure: \$300 per person
60 to 31 days prior to departure:

FUEL SURCHARGES:

Airlines and cruise-lines retain the right to adjust prices based upon market price fuel surcharges. In those cases, Gate1 will adjust your invoice accordingly. In order to avoid these potential charges, your entire group must be paid in full and airline tickets issued.

CURRENCY FLUCTUATIONS:

DOCUMENTS:

email 21 days prior to the onset of services. Paper documents when requested, will be delivered approximately 14-21 days prior to the onset of services. A complete street address is required for mailed documents (no PO boxes).

AIRLINE SEATS:

Any name change may result in that seat being revoked by the carrier. Bulkhead and exit row seats are considered at airport check-in only. Domestic flights are blocked for group seat requests.
