DAILY ITINERARY

SUNDAY, MARCH 18, 2018 - Depart for England

Depart Newark, NJ on a British Air flight arriving in London the following morning. Meals, beverages and entertainment aboard. (Flight times are subject to change until ticketed.)

MONDAY, MARCH 19, 2018 - London / Cardiff, Wales

Upon arrival into London, England, you will be greeted by your Tour Manager after going through customs. We'll travel to the west of England to Cardiff, capital of Wales with a stop at Castle Combe, "The Prettiest Village in England". The village houses are typical Cotswold type. Originally it was a British hill fort for the Romans. Here you have time to wonder through town and enjoy lunch on your own. Upon arrival in Cardiff, you'll have a panoramic tour of the city viewing the Millennium Centre and the National Assembly in Cardiff Bay. See the Millennium Stadium as well as the historic Cardiff Castle during your orientation, before checking into your hotel for 3 nights. Later this afternoon, we depart for a guided tour of Cardiff Castle followed by a fun Welsh banquet dinner in the Castle.

Overnight: Cardiff, Wales Meals: Dinner

TUESDAY, MARCH 20, 2018 - Caerleon / Monmouth / Wye Valley / Tintern

After breakfast, we travel east of Cardiff to Caerleon town, formerly called Isca Silurum, the permanent garrison for the Second Augustan Legion of the Roman army, back in the first century. The extent of Roman remains in the town is impressive, and regarded as Britain's most revealing Roman site. You will tour the Roman Bath House, Amphitheatre and the Roman museum. Next stop is Monmouth, a charming town steeped in history and the birthplace of King Henry V. Photo stop at Britain's last remaining medieval gated bridge, dated 13th century. From Monmouth take a scenic journey, following the flow of the River Wye as we enter the Wye Valley, awarded an 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty'. Our next stop is Tintern where you have some free time and lunch before taking a tour of the 13th century Tintern Abbey. We'll continue our journey through the scenic Wye Valley to the

quaint border town of Chepstow. Entry to the town is through the 13th century gateway, where there are still sections of the medieval town wall still intact. Travel through the town's main street and shopping area to Chepstow Castle, Britain's oldest Norman castle founded in 1067AD. You can either take a tour of the castle on your own (steep climb to the entrance) or free time in the town, walk to the River Wye and across the Regency Cast Iron Bridge which will take you to England. Dinner is on your own this evening.

Overnight: Cardiff, Wales Meals: Breakfast

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 21, 2018 - Swansea / Gower Peninsula

Today we travel west to Swansea, Wales's 'Waterfront City' after free time we then visit Mumbles, which marks the beginning of the Gower Peninsula's coastline and home to some world class ice cream – but don't just take our word for it! This afternoon we visit Gower Heritage Centre where we have arranged for a guide to accompany us on the coach for a guided tour pointing out the highlights of Gower. After our tour we return to the center for a traditional Cream Tea and free time to look around before returning to Cardiff. Enjoy the remainder of your day touring this charming town.

Overnight: Cardiff, Wales Meals: Breakfast

THURSDAY, MARCH 22, 2018 - Bath / Glastonbury / Plymouth

We depart Cardiff for Plymouth with a visit in Bath a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Discover stunning architecture, including the crescents, Pulteney Bridge (modeled on the Ponte Vecchio in Florence) and Bath Abbey. Then, we'll tour the Roman Baths by torchlight, which were built more than 2,000 years ago and are beautifully preserved. You will have time to wonder the town, have lunch or shop before we continue our journey through Devon with an in route visit at Glastonbury. Small in size but rich in offerings, this town is a center of New Age culture and rumored to be the final resting place of King Arthur. It is a mix of English charm, alternative culture and eye-opening spiritual history. Glastonbury Abbey is one of the earliest Christian sites in England. We continue to Plymouth where we will stay for 4 nights. Upon arrival we'll have a panoramic tour. Dinner will be at the hotel this evening.

Overnight: Plymouth Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

FRIDAY, MARCH 23, 2017 - St. Michael's Mount / Marazion / St. Ives

After breakfast, we make our way to the western point of England to the fascinating and historical St Michael's Mount. We'll take a small boat to the island from the little Cornish town of Marazion or depending upon the tide, you can walk across the wet sand to the island. You will discover the medieval castle and delve into the island's past with a visit. Then you will return to the mainland where you'll have time to visit the historic market town of Marazion and lunch on your own. We then make our way to the delightful old fishing town of St Ives where you'll wander along cobbled streets between pretty fishermen's cottages to uncover the legend, history and tradition of this ancient town. You then visit the Minack Theatre, Cornwall's world famous open-air cliff-face theatre. We return to Plymouth

this afternoon where you can enjoy this enchanting town more on your own.

Overnight: Plymouth, UK Meals: Breakfast

SATURDAY, MARCH 24, 2017 - Port Isaac / Padstow / Tintagel / Jamaica Inn

After breakfast, we travel to the Cornish Peninsula and make our way to the rugged cliffs and bays of the north coast of Cornwall. Here we visit the picturesque fishing village of Port Isaac; better known as Port Wen (Doc Martin) where you'll enjoy time to explore the familiar sights of the town. Then onwards along the coast to Padstow to enjoy a true highlight as lunch is served at 'The Seafood Restaurant', the flagship establishment of British television chef Rick Stein which serves a mouth-watering selection of locally sourced seafood and international dishes. Walk-off your food with a stroll around the scenic harbor town before continuing our journey to Tintagel, site of King Arthurs Castle, where you see its breathtaking cliff top setting. Afterwards, we'll travel through the moor with a stop at the Jamaica Inn, believed to hide away smuggler's contraband brought on shore. Here you will visit the Smugglers Museum, Farm Shop or you can even enjoy a libation. We'll then return to Plymouth with the remainder of your afternoon free.

Overnight: Plymouth, UK Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

SUNDAY, MARCH 25, 2017 - Plymouth Hoe / Barbican / Royal William Yard

After breakfast, we visit world famous Plymouth Hoe with its panoramic views and stunning historical significance. See Smeatons Tower the iconic lighthouse which once stood on the fearsome Eddystone reef 14 miles. We head toward Barbican, visiting the Mayflower Steps and museum, seeing the Elizabethan House and visiting the place where it is said the Pilgrim fathers had their last meal before setting out for the New world in 1620. We visit the historic Royal William Yard, the stunning collection of buildings that used to supply the provisions for the Royal Navy. You will have free time and enjoy lunch on your own. After you'll have a guided tour of the Plymouth Gin Distillery before heading back to the hotel. Free time this evening with dinner on your own.

Overnight: Plymouth, UK Meals: Breakfast

MONDAY, MARCH 26, 2017 - Salisbury / Stonehenge / London

After breakfast we depart Plymouth and travel to Salisbury Cathedral where you view a copy of the Magna Carta, signed in 1215 by King John and land barons of medieval England. After time for lunch, on your own, visit the most mysterious prehistoric monument in the world, Stonehenge; named a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Located in the middle of the Salisbury Plain, Stonehenge is unique among stone circles and its construction still defies belief. The first stone was placed here 5,000 years ago with the structure finally completed 1,400 years later. Continue on to London where you will have a panoramic tour before checking into your hotel for 3 nights. Tonight we have dinner at the hotel.

Overnight: London, UK Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

TUESDAY, MARCH 27, 2017 - London Sightseeing

After breakfast, the morning part of the tour begins with a visit to St Paul's Cathedral where we enter as their doors open. We will explore the masterpiece designed by Wren in 1673 with a professional guide, taking time to listen to the 1695 organ that Mendelssohn once played and visit the tombs of Nelson and Wellington. Our next stop is the Changing of the Guards or the Horse Guards Parade (depending upon weather). The afternoon part of the tour begins with a visit to the Tower of London. Arriving at the Tower of London built in 1066 by William the Conqueror, our guide will regale you with fascinating insights into the history of this Royal Palace and fortress. Ample time will be given to view the Crown Jewels and the White Tower and to wander around this imposing fortress. The remainder of the afternoon is free. Take a boat trip on the River Thames or have an afternoon tea.

Overnight: London, UK Meals: Breakfast

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 28, 2017 - Sightseeing Tour of London

Today, enjoy more of London's famous monuments and marvel at the history of London's modern masterpieces from the comfort of your seat with stops along the way for pictures. You will see such sites as Piccadilly Circus, Westminster Abbey, Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament, Trafalgar Square, Harrods' Department Store, and more. The afternoon is free to explore London's sites on your own. World-class museums include the British Museum, National Gallery, Victoria & Albert Museum; London has fantastic parks including Regent's Park, Green Park and Hyde Park/Kensigton Gardens; London's famous shopping streets include Piccadilly, Bond Street and Regent Street. Your Farewell Dinner tonight will be at a local restaurant.
